Each scholarship program recipient will be supported by a caring, trustworthy team to help the student not just succeed, but thrive.

The Private Prep Scholarship Program Provides:

- An initial consultation with a director as well as ongoing support for any questions that arise throughout the process
- 4-6 months of weekly sessions with a live tutor (online or in-person, subject to availability)
- Materials for independent work assignments in between sessions
- Diagnostic tests and analysis to determine whether a student should pursue the SAT or ACT
- Proctored practice tests and analysis of results

Ideal candidates meet the following criteria:

- Unweighted GPA of 3.5 or above in a rigorous course load within their school context (AP, Honors, IB). Completion of Algebra 2/Trigonometry prior to 11th grade is strongly encouraged
- PSAT score of 1060+; diagnostic SAT of 1100+ or ACT of 22+
- Free and reduced lunch or 90%+ scholarship at an independent school
- Demonstrated extracurricular interests/leadership or significant family responsibilities
- A strong desire to attend a four-year college or university
- Preference will be given to 1st generation college-bound students

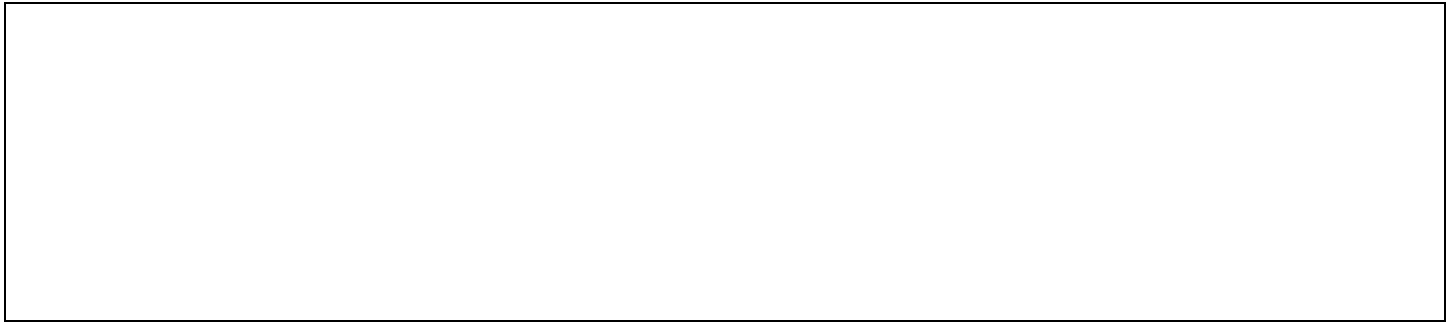
